He will be deeply missed by many brothers-in-law, sisters-in-law, nieces, nephews, and friends. Read more.





Garnet Gardner Chapman of Ottawa, Ontario, passed away on Saturday, August 9, 2025, after a long battle with cancer.

Born in Springhill, Nova Scotia, on October 8, 1939, Garnet was the son of the late Paul and Frances (Merritt) Chapman. Following the separation of his mother and father, Garnet and his brother, Sidney, were raised in a loving home by the late Earl and Marjorie Austin (Chapman) in Rodney, Nova Scotia.

Garnet joined the RCAF at the age of 19 and his career included postings to the No. 6 Repair Depot in Trenton, Ontario, 1 Wing in Marville, France, 1 Wing in Lahr, Germany, 416 sqn in Chatham, New Brunswick, 15 Wing in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan, 17 Wing in Winnipeg, Manitoba and 450 sqn in Ottawa, Ontario. Our most honest players were Eric and Lorette Ellis, Rhona and Steve Bogue (right). They won a free group lesson from Kevin Haime Golf School.
















































Third Annual Branch 641 Social and Fundraiser

- pasta
- granola bars
- baby diapers
- · baby food and formula
- · feminine hygiene products

Red Bags can be dropped off at the branch. Monetary donations to the Barrhaven Food Cupboard are also welcome. Please leave cheques or cash in an envelope inside the Red Bag. I collect the food and monetary donations each day and will maintain a tally, so we know final numbers.
