Branch 641 Expands Our Navy Memorabilia

For the past month, our branch historians, Terry Claessen (aided by his wife Caroline) and Dwayne Hordij, have been busy sourcing, preparing and installing another piece of history at Branch 641 — a Naval Kisbee, also spelled Kisbie.

"We're a little exhausted, this took a day more than a month from the time I received the Kisbee to installation. We have invested at least 50 hours of work into this project. Our final tribute goes to the Navy," said Terry.

"The HMCS Ottawa Kisbee ring has been a long time coming to our branch. From countless promises of "I can get you that" to disappointment, our searching finally paid off.

"At the time our current ship had been deployed to the South China Sea, which is where contact was made with our request to acquire their Kisbee ring. Within a month or two, it was in our hands and the project started to take shape. Many thanks to our contact who would like to stay anonymous. Of course, the ship's company as well for their assistance.

"After years of searching for a centrepiece for our navy display, it is now at home in Barrhaven. If you're looking at our museum wall you will notice an order to our military collections starting with the Navy, the Army and then the Air Force



"There's a line in our opening ceremonies at our general meeting that states, "Those of our comrades who by sea, by land and in the air, laid down their lives, for their Sovereign and Country." It may have been by accident, but it seems fitting. We will remember them."

Terry and Dwayne are the keepers of our military memorabilia at Branch 641. They have toiled for years, collecting, arranging and installing all the donations and acquisitions of Army, Navy and Air Force photos, medals, planes, tanks, etc. that are on display at the branch. You may have noticed the propeller on the wall, and this is also thanks to Terry and Dwayne.
