### **Technology Officer Report**

- 1. POS Modernization Project
  - a. The new hardware, operating system, backup and security software was delivered and configured on site at the branch on Jan 28. This concludes the approved upgrades.
  - b. The new terminals have received mixed reviews from the bartenders, however after some adjustments to the settings and understanding that the new screens are like a smartphone screen, a lighter touch is needed and works best with dry fingers.
  - c. The next aspect of modernization is in relation to the potential acquisition of a third terminal, and its form factor, as well as the potential upgrades to the POS System software and potential integration with QuickBooks and/or card processing systems.

#### 2. Security Cameras

- a. As part of the installation of the new POS System hardware, CapitalPOS had a look at the existing FLIR system and based on their expertise and experience gained through dealing with identical and other competing products.
- b. A few recommendations are being considered to make the current system more stable:
  - i. replace broken parts (one camera)
  - ii. improve the picture for the monitor at the bar
  - iii. add a couple of cameras
- c. A cost-analysis and business case will be produced before further action is taken.
- 3. MailerLite Annual Subscription
  - a. Due Feb 6th, the price appears to have increased from USD \$162.00 to \$180.00
  - b. While QuickBooks has the ability to integrate with MailChimp, this aspect of mass-mailings is not in line with the Branch's use of QBO, and MailChimp remains more expensive than MailerLite.
  - c. I recommend continuing with MailerLite. Motion for Executive approval included separately.

#### 4. M365 Platform

- a. A list of free training resources has been provided. These are in a variety of formats for each of the principal applications, such as written modules available online, training videos and quick reference guides.
- b. A gentle reminder that TEAMS is the platform of choice for saving documents in the Executive Committee Team in the Files tab of your respective channels, which in most cases are only accessible to you and a select few (past Chair if on current Committee) and others identified by role or by request.
