- 3. Interval House of Ottawa Ottawa's first shelter for women and children fleeing abuse since 1970. It provides support, housing and assistance to women AND their children fleeing domestic violence, sexual abuse and/or other domestic/ partner abuse. Referrals to this facility also come from Ottawa Children's Aid and Ottawa police services. In recent years, from donated funds, this facility was updated to include small pets. This was based on studies that showed many women and children will continue to endure abuse as their partner threatens to torture, maim or kill a beloved family pet if they leave the abusive relationship. This is the only women's shelter in Ottawa to offer this facility for pets which has proven to greatly help women and their children leave chronic abusive situations and also help children adapt to family changes and their new environment.
