The Budget is highlighted by a continued emphasis on expenditure restraint, with the aim of ensuring the maximization of profits in support of a new Branch Club House. It is compiled from input received from the Executive Committee members.

I would highlight that the budget conservatively projects a small profit at FY end, with the anticipation that revenues/profits will progressively increase over the year as Branch activities return to the norm and our members and their guests return to take advantage of the many activities sponsored by the Branch. The anticipated increase in profits will permit, to the extent possible, transferring funds to our Building and Land



Trust Fund for a new Club House. Such amount will be determined at FY end dependent on fiscal performance.

The Budget also anticipates and sets aside funds to replace the kitchen stove, which is on its last legs, and to purchase or repair our hall chairs, which have seen better days.

Four Requests for donations were approved at the May Executive Meeting:

#### LONG RANGE PLANNING

Considering that the Anglican Church no longer wishes to partner with us, and that we have the opportunity to add a basement to our new clubhouse, our Long-Range Planning Committee discussed a few options and would like to offer our basement as business offices but with the understanding that they must provide an upfront payment in exchange for free rent for 10 years.

After the condos have been turned over to the new owners, we will have approximately \$650 K which is still short of the million dollar that we need to approach a bank for a mortgage. By renting the basement with an upfront payment of approximately \$500 K, we would have the required funds to move forward on our plans.

We are looking at different option on how to attract businesses to meet our goal. More to follow in the upcoming months.
