For your information, attached is the annual Poppy Fund Report for period 1 October, 2021 to 31 December, 2022.

For the Fiscal Year ending 31 December, 2022, the Branch Poppy Fund, as result of a very successful Poppy Campaign (\$80,000.00 plus), has \$143,006.96 on hand for distribution in support of veterans, community, youth and remembrance.
