MISCALCULATION OF DISABILITY PENSIONS CLASS ACTION SETTLEMENT

https://veteranspensionreglement.kpmg.ca/

If you or a family member or survivor received disability benefits from Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC) between **2003 and 2023** you may be a Class Member of a class action settlement related to alleged miscalculations of disability pensions and benefits.

There are 2 categories of claimants.

If your situation shows that you already have an existing payment relationship with VAC, you will have seen a letter about this class action suit in your MYVAC online account. If you are already receiving benefits, you will automatically receive the adjusted compensation for which you are qualifiable through the usual payment process.

You do not have to submit any further claims.

If prospective class action members **do not have an existing payment relationship with VAC** you must submit a claim form to KPMG or you will not receive compensation, even if you may be eligible for such.

If you are not sure of your status, please reach out to me for assistance.

The deadline to submit a claim form is 19 March 2025.

1. I am honoured to be appointed in this new role, as technology supports most facets of branch activities in the form of hardware, software and services, for audio, visual and communications effects, as well as business processes such as accounting, planning and analysis. The aim of this position is to provide a broader perspective across the branch, in order to avoid decisions or acquisitions being made in silos of excellence, that could end up at cross-purposes or miss opportunities to save money.

2. Projects completed:

- a. Acquisition and implementation of Microsoft 365 Not-For-Profit business licence and configuration of the @rcl641.ca exchange server and creation of volunteer accounts, December 2023.
- b. MailerLite system implemented to become compliant with new international rules and regulations regarding anti-spam and user privacy, February 2024.
- c. Implementation of LoopTV as a branch advertising platform and revenue stream.

3. Projects under consideration:

- a. Backup of all branch online or electronic account details, from usernames and passwords to licensing and serial numbers. (Case in point: unable to change voicemail message)
- b. Inventory of all A/V equipment and creation of simple "How to use" lists.
- c. Upgrading security system cameras and sensors.
- d. Review of Television channels and service delivery options.
- e. Upgrading the bar's Point of Sale system.

- a. Business case proposal to switch from Bell to Rogers for fiber-optical internet and telephone services (To be presented at July Executive Committee meeting).
- b. Write Terms of reference and list of basic duties for the Technology Officer position.
